

They have begun the design process for their DT project – to design Roman Catapults – thinking about the design criteria/ specification needed for a catapult and how they might adapt the basic structure to create the most appropriate and appealing design. Guided reading sessions are in full swing with the one group in the class reading The Infinite Lives of Maisie Day by Christopher Edge and another group reading Fantastic Mr Fox by Roald Dahl. Kiberick have been being historians, focusing on the history skill of chronology (putting things in time order) this week whilst learning about the rise of the Roman Empire.







Free School Meals

If you think you may be eligible for Free School Meals the criteria and link you will need to follow are below. Not only would your child receive free meals but this enables the school to access additional funding. If you would apply by post please contact the office for a paper application form.

Free school meals eligibility criteria if you receive benefits

A child is eligible for free school meals if their parent/carer (or the child themselves) receives any of the following benefits:

Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than $\pounds_{7,400}$, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).

Income Support (IS)

Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance

Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance

Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income of less than £16,190

Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC)

Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Supports

If you are claiming the benefits listed below you are not eligible for free school meals. This is regardless of what other benefits/credits are being claimed.

Working Tax Credit

Contribution-Based Job Seeker's Allowance and/or Contribution-Based Employment and Support Allowance
