Sharing Veryan's learning...

This half term in Carne, we will be thinking thinking about what we want to be when we grow up. Being a Police Officer was top of the list so this week we have been learning all about what it's like to be a Police Officer. The boys have followed clues to track down the jam thief, built a police car and put 'naughty' people (including Mrs McKellar) in jail! We have real Police Officers coming to visit our school on Tuesday 28th of March and the boys have lots of questions they want to ask them!

Year 1 & 2 have been continuing their topic work about the coastline and this week experimented with different media to make representations of waves. They used different textured materials to collage and water colours to paint pictures and then had a multi sensory experience making waves with shaving foam and paint. Sharing Veryan's learning...

Over the past 2 weeks year 2, 3 and 4 have been learning all about length, height and perimeter. They have really enjoyed completing hands on measuring tasks and comparing the length and heights of different objects around our school.

In English Years 1, 2 and 3 have started their new book - Journey by Aaron Becker - a book with NO WORDS! It tells the story of a little girl who finds that everyone is too busy to play with her, however when she finds a red crayon in her bedroom, everything that she draws becomes real. She draws a door in her bedroom wall and is transported into different worlds throughout the book. The children had a great time acting out the beginning scenes and thinking about what the characters might say. They are now working towards developing all of the skills that they need for writing setting descriptions, so that they can design their very own world through their bedroom wall and write a description that will conjure up a magnificent picture in the readers mind.

In topic we have begun learning about the mountains part of our Misty mountains, winding rivers topic. We have carried out activities that represent how different types of mountains are made and we have been on a fact hunt around the play ground to start us all off with the key facts we need to know about mountains. Our RE this term focuses on Jesus and the build up to Easter with Years 5 and 6 answering the question What kind of King was Jesus? and year 3 and 4 focussing on understanding the impact of Pentecost.



Year 5 have been continuing there learning multiplication and division and year 6 have been learning algebra, which they took to very well and have been proud of their own achievements.

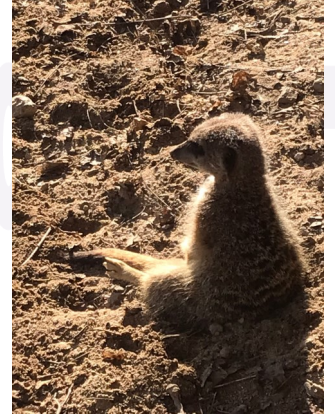

Should I keep my child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

No

but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

Free School Meals

If you think you may be eligible for Free School Meals the criteria and link you will need to follow are below. Not only would your child receive free meals but this enables the school to access additional funding. If you would apply by post please contact the office for a paper application form.

Free school meals eligibility criteria if you receive benefits

A child is eligible for free school meals if their parent/carer (or the child themselves) receives any of the following benefits:

Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).

Income Support (IS)

Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance

Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance

Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income of less than £16,190

Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC)

Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Supports

If you are claiming the benefits listed below you are not eligible for free school meals. This is regardless of what other benefits/credits are being claimed.

Working Tax Credit

Contribution-Based Job Seeker's Allowance and/or Contribution-Based Employment and Support Allowance
