Thank you and well done to all the parents, staff and children at Veryan school who have sensibly followed government guidelines and worked with the school to try to prevent the spread of infection through diligent hygiene and self isolation where it's been needed. Mrs Allan will endeavour to pass your email to the relevant teacher/staff in a timely manner between 9am and 11am on school days, however, please be patient as Mrs Allan will also be home schooling her family and dealing with other work matters from home and responses may not be immediate.
