Mrs. Bennett arranged for the real Fire Brigade to come, with their fire engine, to talk to all of the children about what Fire Fighters actually do!

The children tried on the heavy helmets, held the hose and climbed into the cab. They also saw the very big cutting equipment which the firefighters use to cut people out of their cars when they have a crash.

When we got back to class, Carne and year one turned our classroom and playground into a Fire station. They dressed up as firefighters and problem solved how to get the water into a hose to put out a fire.

I think we have some very good candidates for the fire service of the future, don't you agree!









































Over the last 2 weeks, all year groups have worked really hard to complete various assessments and I have been incredibly impressed with their attitude towards these. We have had positive outlooks and resilience across the board. In topic Key stage 2 have finished their learning about mountains by looking at specific mountains from around the world and in the UK, as well as carrying out practical activities to explain the way that different mountains are formed. Year 5 and 6 have learnt how to give a place's location using the relative location to another place. We have now moved on to learning about the water cycle and we had a fantastic time yesterday creating a water cycle on the working wall that we can refer to throughout our learning. Years 2, 3 and 4 have begun learning about fractions and particularly enjoyed relating this to food based examples! Pendower also very much enjoyed our visit from St Mawes fire crew..



Year 5 have been continuing there learning multiplication and division and year 6 have been learning algebra, which they took to very well and have been proud of their own achievements.





#### Free School Meals

If you think you may be eligible for Free School Meals the criteria and link you will need to follow are below. Not only would your child receive free meals but this enables the school to access additional funding. If you would apply by post please contact the office for a paper application form.

#### Free school meals eligibility criteria if you receive benefits

A child is eligible for free school meals if their parent/carer (or the child themselves) receives any of the following benefits:

Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).

Income Support (IS)

Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance

Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance

Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income of less than £16,190

Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC)

Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Supports

If you are claiming the benefits listed below you are not eligible for free school meals. This is regardless of what other benefits/credits are being claimed.

Working Tax Credit

Contribution-Based Job Seeker's Allowance and/or Contribution-Based Employment and Support Allowance
