Congratulations and many thanks to our fantastic PFA for organising and running another successful Christmas Fair.


Thanks to everyone who came along on the day to support, or contributed and donated. Together you raised around £1400 for the school and our children!

Test the batteries in your smoke alarm every week. Never remove them.
