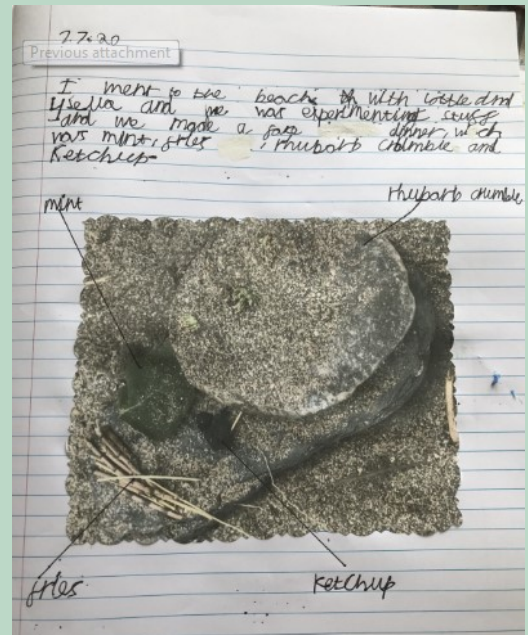


Amy's personal project was to design her Gran's house—
