#### Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been so lovely to welcome you and your children back to school this term. I want to take this opportunity to thank you for engaging so proactively with the changes and for preparing your children so well for the return to school. Your children are a real credit to you and have impressed us all with the way they have adjusted so quickly to the new routines and the changes to entering and exiting the school. You may have noticed at the beginning of the term, all of the teachers came out to greet their classes and walk them into school. This was to ensure that the children were supported in the new procedure. We very quickly observed that the children were taking themselves straight into school confidently. In response to this credible behaviour, we have reduced the presence of teachers on the playground as the days have passed. The teachers have reported that children are entering school in a responsible and calm manner and that the extra time this allows has meant that they have been able to give attention to individual children when they come in and engage in reading and other focussed activities. I will continue to meet and greet you and the children at the school gate and intend to remain there until 8:55am so that if you need to get last minute messages to your child's teacher in the morning you can communicate them to me and I will pass them on as I walk through school after drop off. Please continue to use Class Dojo as your direct line to the teachers. Should you wish to discuss anything with the class teacher in more depth you can make an appointment at the school office where we will do our best to find a time to accommodate you.

I am very excited to be able to finally launch an after school wraparound care provision from 3:15-4:15pm Monday to Friday. This is bookable and payable via ParentPay and will begin on Tuesday the 20<sup>th</sup> September.

I am also very pleased to welcome Mr Webb back to Veryan who will be delivering PE lessons every Monday. In addition to the wraparound provision, Mr Webb will be providing a sports club. This club is free of charge and open to children in years 1 -6. Sign up will be on a first come first served basis, so please contact the school office if you would like to book your child in. This will run on Mondays from the 26<sup>th</sup> September.

As you know, we will be closed on Monday the 19<sup>th</sup> to pay our respects to our late Queen Elizabeth II.

#### Carne...



You may be aware that Cornwall Outdoors, the Council's outdoor education provider, ceases to trade on 31<sup>st</sup> July. The covid pandemic has given us a greater understanding of how important it is to experience the great outdoors. There is a large and rapidly growing body of evidence about the benefits of outdoor learning and play for our young people, including improved language and communication skills, motivation, independence, confidence and self-esteem, concentration, selfevaluation, creativity and openness to new perspectives.

There is an opportunity to carry on outdoor education at the former Roseland Outdoor Education Centre through its purchase from Cornwall Council. A charity has been established to provide this, the Roseland Centre (registered charity number 1186095). The charity has an Option to Purchase and are trying to raise £240,000 to enable this.

In order to do this a Crowdfunder campaign will be launched on 19<sup>th</sup> July. Ahead of the Crowdfunder over £80,000 has been pledged towards it from St Just in Roseland Parish Council and parishioners, which shows the support for, and confidence in, the project. The benefit though will be for the Roseland and young people from across Cornwall.

#### Free School Meals

If you think you may be eligible for Free School Meals the criteria and link you will need to follow are below. Not only would your child receive free meals but this enables the school to access additional funding. If you would apply by post please contact the office for a paper application form.

Free school meals eligibility criteria if you receive benefits

A child is eligible for free school meals if their parent/carer (or the child themselves) receives any of the following benefits:

Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).

Income Support (IS)

Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance

Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance

Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income of less than £16,190

Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC)

Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Supports

If you are claiming the benefits listed below you are not eligible for free school meals. This is regardless of what other benefits/credits are being claimed.

Working Tax Credit

Contribution-Based Job Seeker's Allowance and/or Contribution-Based Employment and Support Allowance
