






We have been talking about various life cycles and we mals and their babies.

Move Up Day

You will have seen in the calendar that on Thursday 1st July we had intended to combine our Year 6's transition to the Roseland Academy with a whole school move up day. Sadly, the year 6 transition is in some doubt for this date following the recent Government updates and we await confirmation from The Roseland as to whether this will be going ahead.

However, we would still like to have a transition session for all our pupils and welcome our new September starters; so instead of the planned full day, we will now amend this to a morning transition session only and our year 6 leavers will take part in a morning activity at school if they are unable to visit The Roseland Academy on that day.

What should the children expect on 'move up day?'

Your child will come to school as normal and enter with their current class. Their teacher will then lead them to their new classroom (where applicable) where they will then spend the morning taking part in fun activities where they can get to know their new classroom, teacher and classmates.

The children will have lunch together and lunch play together, then return to the existing class for the afternoon session.

This was part of our 'We Are Geographers' topic, but also part of transition for the younger children coming to join us in Pendower in September. We were able to teach them how to complete the orienteering from the skills that we had learnt.




Dakota has been a little bit extra crafty this week too—making her very own horse tail! We think it will definitely make galloping around the playground a lot more fun!
